

### **REPORT ON BRAINSTORMING**

On February 18<sup>th</sup>, a group of eight Kensington Park residents met to discuss ways to increase participation

in the Kensington Park Civic Association. Jane Grogg from the County Office of Neighborhood Services facilitated the meeting. She



began by describing the changing demographics of the neighborhood, which include a younger average age, more diversity, more school age children, more renters and a higher vacancy rate than the County average.

Ideas were then submitted by the attendees. These ideas fell into three basic categories: (1) Events (2) Connections and (3) Visions, Values and Purposes. Some of the specific ideas included: a street fair or block party, dinners, Latino cultural events, the need for an activities director, more items in the newsletter, translating the newsletter into Spanish, improved relations with other organizations and agencies such as Gocio School, Calvary Chapel, St. Jude, and charity foundations, and support for adult education and summer camp for students. Other ideas that were submitted in writing but didn't get mentioned in the discussion included commissioning a mural for the 17<sup>th</sup> St. and Beneva intersection wall, getting young people to do video logs about the community, increased use of the KP Facebook site, a new covered bus stop shelter at Ridge Ave. and 27th St, enlisting more volunteers for the Security Patrol, and teaching neighbors how to use the Nextdoor Program. Throughout the discussion, it was apparent that the Association needs to do more to broaden its appeal to all members of the neighborhood and to develop activities to serve people not currently being served. In a follow up meeting, the Association Board agreed to collaborate with the County Government and the Community Foundation to sponsor a series of scholarships to pay for adult education programs and summer camp membership for students. mosquitoes.


### What You Can Do

• Dump, flush or discard all rain-filled containers in your yard every three days.




- Clean out eaves, and gutters.

### SECURITY PATROL REPORT

Think about a neighborhood where cars are frequently broken into. People are reluctant to walk their streets at night, homes being vandalized. Police are always being called for something bad going on. Now think how glad you are to be living in Kensington Park with very little crime.

With 1100 homes and over 3500 residents we have very few incidents reported. Many bad things can be avoided by locking our cars at all times and keeping a light on outside. The crime reports you see here are sent to us from the county Sheriff's office.

This neighborhood program was started in the late 1970's or early 1980's. It was discontinued in 1988 due to lack of interest. Then in 1996 it was reinstated by Eddie and Naomi Duff. Volunteers drive the neighborhood on designated days, with very few signs of anything unusual. More than anything else the Security Patrol is successful at promoting a feeling of safety within the neighborhood, rather than actually spotting a crime in progress. Members of the Security Patrol never leave their car, are paid for gas (optional), and never attempt to confront an individual. Volunteers are encouraged to call in anything suspicious to the Sheriff's Office. The nonemergency # is 316 – 1201. This is a very easy way to get involved in the neighborhood while providing a worthwhile service.

### WHAT SHOULD YOU DO IF YOU FALL?

- 1. Calm yourself
- 2. Check your body for injury

3. Assess your surroundings and make a plan for getting up

- 4. Slowly roll onto your elbows and knees
- 5. Crawl to a place where you can pull yourself up
- 6. Call a friend

### MOSQUITO continued

Mosquito Larvae also grow in Bromeliads Plants. You can see if your bromeliads contain larvae by siphoning water from the plants with a turkey baster. Squirt the water into a bowl. The larvae look like wiggling worms. What You Can Do--Use flying insect killer labeled for adult mosquitoes . Once a month, spray a light mist over the plant and allow it to settle. This keeps away egg-laying adult mosquitoes.

• Volunteer for large projects when asked. Cleaning, trimming, the buffer zone behind the Northeast Plaza Shopping Center, planting/watering. Having some basic equipment is helpful but not necessary.

### KEEP KENSINGTON PARK A SAFE & HEALTHY NEIGHBORHOOD

Keeping Kensington Park a safe and healthy community isn't all about the humans, the effort includes making sure domesticated animals are properly cared for as well. Failing to do so could present personal and financial hardship for the pet owner and their neighbors.

There are several important things pet owners should remember. First, you are required to have your dog/cat vaccinated against rabies and licensed. Dogs and cats are not permitted to roam free on public or other

people's personal property. An animal that is repeatedly found roaming, damaging property, causing a



disturbance or attacking another animal is considered a nuisance and is subject to removal from the owner.

The Sarasota County Sheriff's Office Animal Services Section reserves the right to impound an animal in violation of Sarasota County Code Chapter 14, and may levy fines against the animal's owner. Fines for an unlicensed dog or cat begin at \$55.00 for the first

offense, \$105.00 for the Second, and \$200.00 for the third and subsequent violations. The same penalties can be given if your dog or cat is running loose or seen as a public

nuisance. Pet owners are also subject to fines for infractions such as cruelty to animals, abandonment, having animals on public property such as school grounds (service animals not included), or transporting an unsecured animal in a pickup truck bed.
